It's disappointing to report that as the Club enters its 70th year in 2016 we seem no closer to securing the long-term future of our beloved home ground. Notwithstanding the interesting redevelopment plans for the Oval put forward late last year, which I welcomed in my 2014 report, there seems little to report from the last twelve months. It would appear Warringah Council gave little serious consideration to the proposal.

The Brookvale Oval Committee I previously headed up was disbanded by the owners early in the year as they wished to pursue a different course of action. However the work of the Committee which included positive meetings with the Premier, Mike Baird and the NRL which contributed to an excellent feasibility study, complete with detailed plans and costings, and productive discussions with St Augustine's College around increasing its use for other purposes provides a valuable resource for any future funding negotiations. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Committee who contributed their time and passion to this important issue for the future of our Club.

More broadly, the New South Wales Government, supported by the NRL, is pursuing its Stadia Strategy which focuses on upgrading and building top tier stadiums in central locations, such as Moore Park and western Sydney. Thanks to the fact that Brookvale Oval was continually overlooked for government funding when all the other NRL stadiums were receiving tens of millions of dollars back in the 1990s and early 2000s, it is listed as a tier 2 stadium and therefore not eligible for funding.

This year's State Budget saw \$600 million allocated to the stadia strategy. Obviously, to make these stadia financially successful the State Government needs as many NRL teams and teams from other major sporting codes to use them on a regular basis. While this is an entirely reasonable proposition for many Sydney-based NRL Clubs that can access these grounds relatively quickly and easily either by car or public transport (trains), this doesn't work for the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles. Over the years I've had several meetings with both NRL officials and State Government representatives who all acknowledge this to be a valid concern, and agree we are a separate case, and yet we are still to see any significant financial commitment come forth.

The Federal Government's \$10 million commitment back in 2013 was of course welcome, but unfortunately, without matching contributions from the State and other bodies such as the NRL, it on its own will do very little to enable the Sea Eagles to build the additional undercover seating at Brookvale Oval it so desperately needs to survive financially.

Nobody reading this report would be unaware of the challenges the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles administration face continuing to play from Brookvale Oval. With only a limited number of undercover seats to sell to members, coupled with the exorbitant and totally unreasonable costs imposed by Warringah Council, the Club has an impossible task when it comes to just breaking even on game day. Once all the undercover seats are sold, the Club relies on elements outside its control to get more people through the gates, weather of course being the number one factor, but also the willingness of our supporters to turn up and sit on a patch of grass. And despite the huge sums the Club, as the sole tenant, pays for the privilege of using the ground, the spectator facilities and condition of the playing surface have made this task even harder.

This year has been a difficult one for loyal supporters. The ongoing speculation about the future of the Coach and club legend, Geoff Toovey from day one of the season, the instability around the futures and retention of the best two halves in the game which at one point had the Sea Eagles losing both, and an extraordinary run of injuries no doubt contributed to a lack of success on the field in the first half of the season and declining attendances at home games.

But the fact is, we need our members and supporters to turn up to home games in big numbers and we need them to be vocal in their support for significant funding for our home ground so we can demonstrate how important our Team and Fortress Brookvale are to the Manly-Warringah region.

The alternative is more home games being played away at more profitable venues in order to raise the revenue to keep the Club afloat or, worse, being moved away permanently. I don't believe anyone wants to see that happen, and I continue to make myself available to the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles to assist in any way possible.

I believe in our 70th year of existence as one of the most successful rugby league clubs in the competition we must redouble our efforts to secure the future of Brookvale Oval and our team. We should use every opportunity to remind governments - local, State and Federal - of our proud record and our value to the region and the game. Every player, as a spokesman for our Club, is a potential advocate for Brookvale Oval, and should be enlisted to the cause along with our former players and other Club identities.

I sincerely hope this time next year we will be celebrating a great 2016 season on the field and a truly successful 70th year as a Club, including the announcement of significant funding for Brookvale Oval which has served as our physical and spiritual home since 1947 and the home of rugby league in the region since 1932.

The 2015 season was one of gradual progression. Our initial form was average and we were just finding our way as a new side with several new signings but we soon found our niche and gathered some wins to keep us in and around the top 8.

This was advanced by Jayden Hodges, who in his second year at the Sea eagles was proving too good for the NSW Cup level. 2015 NYC SEASON REVIEW

Season 2015 for the National Youth Competition (NYC) was the most successful for any Junior Grade team at the Manly Warringah Sea Eagles for many years. The team competed on the first weekend in October for a chance at being the premiers after finishing fourth in the minor premiership. Unfortunately, the team could not quite finish the season off as they should have and went down to the Penrith Panthers in 35 degree conditions at ANZ Stadium.

The season started very well with the team winning their first five games in a row. The successful start was a great indication that our pre-season work was spot on and it allowed us to start well ahead of a number of teams within the competition. A number of players made their mark early in the season with Tom Trbojevic, Lucas Price, Hugh Pratt, Will Pearsall and Captain Riley Travers being the stand outs. These early points certainly helped us cement 4th position on the ladder later in the year.

Throughout the middle section of the competition the team struggled to find the consistent form we'd seen early on. A number of reasons seemed to contribute to this. As is the way in rugby league we had a number of injuries with both Lucas Price and Rhys Armstrong suffering season ending injuries. Luke Garner played a number of games in NSW Cup and Tom Trbojevic made his NRL 1st Grade debut. As Brookvale's surface had issues early on the team did not play a home game from Round 3 until Round 17. It certainly made things difficult, but no doubt it helped build a resilience within the team that made a difference at semi final time.

Throughout the middle section of the season we saw a number of players really start to gain confidence and show how much potential they have. Liam Knight, Darcy Cox, Nick Lynn and James Parker led the forward pack while Jesse Ramien and Addison Demetriou became very potent weapons in both attack and defence. We had Billy Bainbridge join us after a very successful S.G. Ball season, along with a number of others, and Billy certainly made his presence felt.

The team deservedly had a number of players make representative sides at this time. Jesse Ramien and Billy Bainbridge made the NSW under 18's side, while Liam Knight and Addison Demetriou made the NSW under 20's side. All players represented their state with pride, the 20's being victorious and the 18's unfortunately going down. Other representative honours saw both Tom Trbojevic and Addison Demetriou make the NYC Team of the year, joining the likes of Daly Cherry-Evans and Jamie Buhner to have previously been given this honour.

As the season passed the Round 20 mark we witnessed a gain in confidence within the team that would ultimately take us all the way to the Grand Final. The side won their last five games in a row, similar to the start of the season. Throughout this period we saw some outstanding attacking performances against both Canberra and the Roosters and we also witnessed some amazing defensive performances with the team keeping the opposition to zero in a number of halves of football. This is obviously very difficult to achieve which I think highlighted the dominance of the team. The concluding game of the season round competition saw the most dominant performance of the lot with a 52 - 6 win over the Sharks at Shark Park. The team had already cemented fourth spot on the ladder going in to the game and had a couple of players playing both NRL and NSW Cup. These factors did not affect the playing group with the most complete first half that we'd put together all season. Unfortunately we lost Nick Lynn in this game after he suffered a season ending pectoral injury. His leadership in the middle was missed in the semi finals.

Our Semi Final campaign did not start as well as we wanted, going down to Penrith at ANZ. We were outplayed on the day and it gave the team a reality check in relation to playing Semi Finals. The team learnt we had to ensure we played our game and weren't put off by the opposition. The team bounced back against the Tigers in Week 2, producing an excellent start to the game and an inspired second half defensive effort. This victory was the first win in a Semi Final for any Sea Eagles NYC team, a great effort and certainly well deserved. It set up a game against the Cowboys in Melbourne the following Saturday.

In Melbourne the team played without fear and controlled the game to perfection. The Cowboys didn't handle the pressure of Semi Final football as well and ultimately couldn't cope with our defensive pressure. The game culminated with Nicho Hynes calmly kicking a field goal in the final couple of minutes, a great effort from a player who played many positions for the team throughout the year. As has already been mentioned we did not claim the premiership, falling short against the Panthers, a team we could not defeat throughout the season, therefore I viewed them as much deserved Premiers. The Semi Finals saw all players that represented the Sea Eagles excel. The stand out performers throughout the series were Liam Knight, Luke Garner, Addison Demetriou, Jesse Ramien, Tom Trbojevic, Hugh Pratt and Riley Travers. The team developed a belief in themselves that allowed all players contribute to the success.

Congratulations to all the players that represented the Sea Eagles NYC in 2015. The season requires a squad of over 30 players and there are many times throughout the season that the resilience of all players within that squad is tested. Unfortunately not all players can have a successful, fulfilling season. To all of the players, thank you for your efforts, all the players within the squad should be proud of being part of this group.

Finally thank you very much to all my staff for your efforts in Season 2015. I feel as though our hard work, expertise and commitment was rewarded through our on field performances. This doesn't always occur, therefore we should all feel privileged to have been part of this season. Thank you to all within the football office that helped both put this team together and helped keep it going throughout the season. There was a true spirit within the club that fostered trust and allowed all to show their potential. I have been honoured to have been the Head Coach of the Manly Sea Eagles NYC for the past three years, I have learnt a lot from the people around me, both players and staff, and for that I am very grateful. 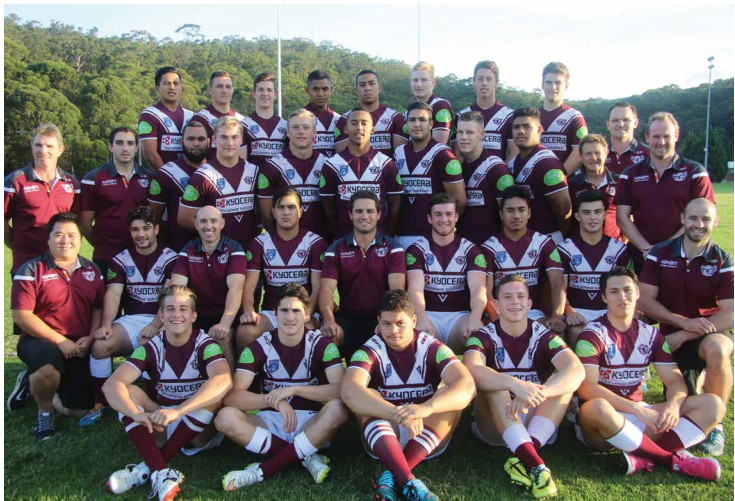

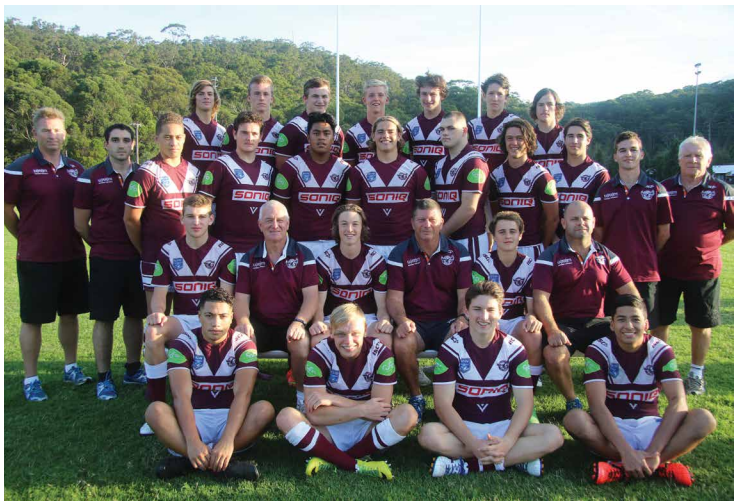

There are many future sea eagle stars running around in the junior league aspiring to pull on a maroon and white jersey.

It is appropriate to congratulate all teams that reached the Semi Finals and Grand Finals but more importantly, all of our registered players who strapped on the boots and had a go - win, lose or draw. The benefits of playing in a team sport like rugby league are significant and you make friends for life whilst having fun along the way.

The task of running the junior league can be challenging but we only succeed because of the huge contribution made by our large band of volunteers who give up their own precious time to help promote kids playing football. These people set up the fields, run the canteen, cook the barbecue, clean up the grounds, coach, manage and supervise the various teams and I thank them for their assistance.

I would also like to thank the Referees for their contribution to junior rugby league which at times can be demanding as everyone seems to be an expert on the sideline. I am always amazed when a spectator can see a "knock on" from fifty metres away but the referee was in line with the players and "deliberately" missed it. I would like to encourage anyone who thinks they can do better to get your referees ticket and get involved.

It is also important to highlight the financial assistance provided by the Manly-Warringah Leagues Club. This support assists the junior rugby league in running all of our competitions and directly benefits every player and every family by helping to keep our registration fees low in comparison to other sporting codes. I would encourage anyone who is not already a member to join the Leagues Club. Thanks also to the Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club who provide independent technical and administration support and the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles who provide training, coaching, player promotion and registration assistance. The Junior League is in the fortunate position to receive scholarship and support from these three organisations, if required, and we are proud to be associated with them.

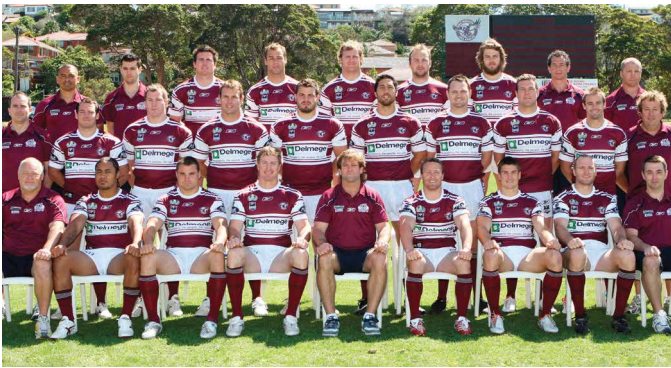

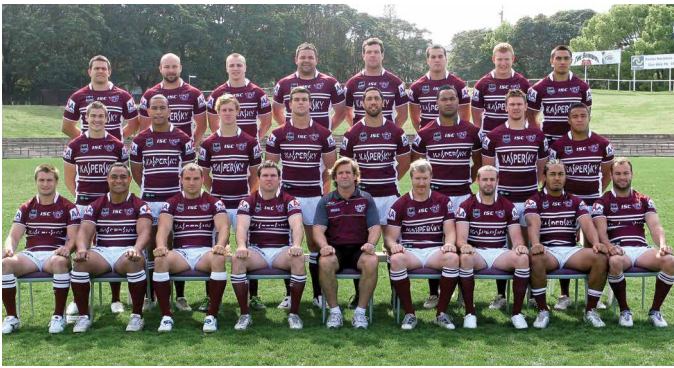
