We present the 2022 Annual Report of the Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club (MWRLFC).

We are proud to produce the Report as has been done every year since 1946, including the statistics for all grades. We believe we owe it to every player who pulls on the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles jersey to have their name and other details recorded in this document, whether they played one game or 300 games.

By producing this report, we do not purport to represent ourselves as the Manly Warringah Sea Eagles Limited (MWSE Ltd) which is a separate legal entity administering and funding the Team.

The MWRLFC of which you are a member is a minority owner of the MWSE Ltd. That means that MWRLFC members also have an ownership stake in the MWSE Ltd, the Sea Eagles.

The MWRLFC holds the Preference Share in the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles Ltd which gives our members, through their right to vote, determination over the Team's name, colours, and its home ground, as well as two voting positions on the MWSE Ltd Board which, like the Football Club has seven members.

It is pleasing that our membership numbers remain strong. It is important that we maintain our relevance as an organisation. Strong membership numbers ensure the voice of our members (Sea Eagles fans) cannot be ignored. Our voice and our place within the Sea Eagles family is always important in the event there is a change to the ownership or governance of the Sea Eagles.

As always, we encourage MWRLFC members wherever possible and affordable, to also be members of the Sea Eagles.

This report has largely been compiled from publicly available data and our own records with all photography credits to the Sea Eagles. We thank all the contributors for their reports. The production of the Report is done on a voluntary basis and the cost of printing the Report is wholly funded by the MWRLFC through the membership income.

As with last year's cover featuring 2021 Dally M Winner Tom Trbojevic, it was easy to decide who should grace this year's cover. Lachlan Croker made an outstanding contribution to the Sea Eagles in 2022, both on and off the field. Lachlan played 24 of 25 games and was the worthy winner of the Roy Bull Best and Fairest Award.

And speaking of awards, we also congratulate Shelley O'Malley, Event and Operations Manager of the Sea Eagles, who was the worthy winner of the Doug Daley Club Person of the Year Award – the first woman to achieve this recognition. Congratulations Shelley.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



I am pleased to once more present the Annual Report of the Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club for 2022.

The 2022 Season

Probably the only way to describe our season across the entire Club is disappointing. The year started with great promise following the successes of 2021 where our NRL team were one game away from the Grand Final, our Harold Matthews side were undefeated Premiers, and the SG Ball side made the Semi-Finals. As the statistics on the following pages demonstrate, our results across junior and senior representative side were underwhelming to say the least.

Clearly many things didn't go our way. Once more our NRL team was impacted by a large number of injuries. There has been a lot of talk about the final seven games of our season, but little discussion involving the number of season-ending injuries experienced in those final weeks –

Reuben Garrick, Jason Saab and Jake Trbojevic to name a few. Not one of the players 1-5 who took the field on game 1 of the season were there in the final regular season match in Round 25.

If ever two games symbolise our season – it would be the two matches we played against the Bulldogs - the first in Round 3 at 4 Pines/Brookvale Oval, the second in the final game at Accor Stadium. The Round 3 match was our first home game after two "respectable" losses against the Premiership Panthers and the always fancied Roosters. It coincided with the opening of the Bob Fulton stand and despite the absolutely torrential rain, was played in front of 13,261 die-hard supporters. With three and a bit minutes left on the clock, and the score locked 12-12, DCE potted a field goal to take the lead. In the 78th minute Matt Burton unsuccessfully attempted a two-point field goal. The Sea Eagles prevailed and went on to win three more games on the trot. Our season had really started. Fast forward to Round 25, with one minute and 40 seconds left on the clock and the game locked at 20-20, Matt Burton kicks a field goal to win the game. The season that had started with a field goal ended with a field goal, and the promise of the 2022 season was extinguished in the cruellest way possible.

On the bright side, throughout the season we saw the emergence of future NRL stars such as Tolutau Koula and Kaeo Weekes, along with the debuts of players like Zac Fulton, Alfred Smalley and Ray Vaega.

Much has been said about Round 20 and its impact on our performance. I don't intend to add to the commentary, except to make the obvious point that what the incident showed was that as a Club we need to do a lot better. We need to improve our leadership, our processes, and our communications across the Board for the sake of our supporters, our players, staff, and Club as a whole. Hopefully we have learned from the experience and are able to manage future challenges more professionally.

On that note, we welcome Tony Mestrov as the Club's new CEO. Tony comes to us with Manly DNA as a local junior and former first grade player. But he also comes with a wealth of experience in rugby league administration with the Gold Coast Titans and as the former CEO of Greyhounds NSW, surely at the time one of the toughest gigs around. Our Club needs Tony's expertise and leadership to help get the show back on track and put us back where we belong – in the winning circle. No pressure at all! Welcome home Tony.

Representative Honours

Congratulations to all the players from our Club who have represented their countries in the 2022 Rugby League World Cup – Daly Cherry Evans and Jake Trbojevic (Australia), Kieran Foran (New Zealand), Martin Taupau and Josh Aloiai (Samoa), Haumole Olakau'atu, Tolutau Koula and Christian Tuipulotu (Mate Ma'a Tonga), Joe Tramontana – Blacktown Workers Sea Eagles (Italy), James Roumanos and Bilal Maarbani – Blacktown Workers Sea Eagles (Lebanon). This is in addition to Dylan Walker and Morgan Harper representing the victorious Maori Team against the Indigenous Team in the All-Stars Match played in February 2022.

Congratulations also to Daly Cherry-Evans and Jake Trbojevic for representing Queensland and New South Wales respectively in the 2022 State of Origin Series and well done DCE for the win as Captain. DCE also successfully Captained the Prime Minister's XIII against Papua New Guinea.

Brookvale Oval

Round 3 saw the memorable opening of the new Bob Fulton stand in the match against the Bulldogs. The stand proved to be a great success with our fans and corporate guests, offering a wonderful view of the game from behind the posts. It was also an honour for me personally to have the southern stand renamed the Lyons-Menzies stand. There is no greater honour — a permanent reminder of the great playing partnership I enjoyed with the Beaver (Steve Menzies). I thank former CEO, Stephen Humphreys and the Board of the Sea Eagles for that show of support and respect.

The only downside was the NSW Government's decision to renege at the 11th hour on their financial support for the full upgrade of 4 Pines Park/Brookvale Oval. It continues to be a matter of great disappointment that Clubs like the Roosters, Parramatta, Titans, Storm, Cowboys and now Penrith receive government funded new state of the art stadiums and the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles and its fans continue to be overlooked for similar funding. It creates an uneven playing field amongst clubs. As we always say, why do Sea Eagles supporters deserve less than any other Club?

Farewells

Sadly, we farewell players who have given great service to our Club – Martin Taupau (156 games) and Dylan Walker (124 games), and Andrew Davey (20 games) – and once more Kieran Foran (196 games). In his last two seasons with the Sea Eagles, Kieran played 49 out of a possible 51 games. It is a tragedy that Kieran isn't seeing out his career with the Manly Sea Eagles and achieving the 200 games milestone, but we wish Kieran and his family all the very best with the Titans. We can always hope that he might return for those final four games.

During the season we also farewelled club favourite Jorge Taufua. Jorge came to the Sea Eagles in 2011 and made his first grade debut the following year where he scored some incredible tries and earned the Club's Rookie of the Year Award. During his time with the Sea Eagles Jorge represented City Origin and Tonga. Later in his career he became renowned for his big hits, the most famous being the hit on Cameron Munster in 2019 – the hit that went viral! Jorge leaves the Club having played 164 first grade games.

And as our foreword acknowledges, Des Hasler will not be the Head Coach with Manly in 2023. We wish Des's departure was on better terms, however nothing will ever diminish Des's contribution to our Club and his achievements as both player and coach. When we struggled our way out of the Northern Eagles debacle, Des was the coach who rebuilt the Club's pride and winning DNA. He built a dynasty — a decade of success that saw us compete in 10 consecutive finals series and win two premierships. Thank you, Des.

We also pay tribute to and thank some other key coaching staff who have departed the Club at the end of 2022 – Don Singe, Head of Performance over a nearly 20-year period and Assistant Coaches Chad Randall and Michael Monaghan.

2023 - Looking forward

Despite, or possibly because of, the disappointments of 2022, we look forward to 2023. We are happy the Club has retained Reuben Garrick until the end of 2027, as well as extending Lachlan Croker, Haumole Olakau'atu, Sean Keppie and Jason Saab. We hope to see Tommy Turbo make a successful return from injury and return to his barnstorming best. We also look forward to the further development and progression of Josh Schuster, Tolu Koula, Kaeo Weekes and Christian Tuipulotu.

A new coaching team led by Anthony Seibold, with premiership winning coach Shane Flanagan and experienced assistant coach Jim Dymock will lead the team in 2023. We wish them well.

I'm excited that 2023 will also see the entry of a Sea Eagles Women's team in the NSWRL Tarsha Gale (under 19) Cup. It is a great shame that to date the Sea Eagles have lagged so badly in the development of the women's game, so this is a great first step and pathway towards us having a team in the NRLW in 2025.

The Board

As always, I thank my fellow Board Members of the MWRLFC for their continued efforts and support. As I point out each and every year, we work on a voluntary basis and our purpose is to serve our loyal members and uphold the role of our organisation which is to preserve the important traditions and heritage of our Club. I want to thank the members of my Board – Alan Thompson, David O'Donnell, Julie Sibraa, Scotty Wilcox, Nick Curulli and Alf Czharn for their work and their support over the year.

David O'Donnell has recently taken up a position with the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles as the new Pathways and Women's Program Manager. This is a great appointment and I have no doubt Dave will do a superb job in helping to bring through the Sea Eagles stars of the future, including from the ranks of local juniors. He will also play an extremely important role in getting the Club set up for the Sea Eagles women's team. Sadly, this means Dave has had to resign from his position on the Board of the MWRLFC. It is a great loss to us as Dave has made a significant contribution to the work of the MWRLFC and on behalf of the Board I thank Dave for all the time and effort he has made.

I am, however, pleased to report that former Manly great Ian "Magilla" Thomson has joined our Board to fill Dave's vacant position. I'm sure Ian needs no introduction to you, but apart from his rugby league and Sea Eagles pedigree as a first-grade player and member of the famous 1978 premiership winning side, Ian also has substantial business and administration expertise as a former CEO of the Northern Eagles/Sea Eagles,

former Chair of the Manly Warringah Leagues Club and now CEO of Forestville RSL Club. It is not widely recognised but Ian should probably hold the title as the man who saved the Sea Eagles when we were teetering on the very brink of extinction. Welcome aboard Ian!

Finally, to you our loyal and committed members, thank you for continuing your membership. I wish you a safe and happy Christmas and look forward to seeing you at Brookvale Oval next year.

On behalf of the Board of the Manly Warringah District Junior Rugby Football League, I am pleased to present this report for the 2022 season.

Thankfully, we were able to play the season uninterrupted by the COVID pandemic. This was a great relief after experiencing severe interruptions to both the 2020 and 2021 seasons.

All our junior league clubs did an exceptional job in managing all the difficulties over the past two seasons caused by COVID and we were basically able to retain our total player numbers despite these difficulties, including the 2021 season being called off in late June.

It is also important to highlight the financial assistance provided by the Manly Leagues Club which has supported the M-W District Junior Rugby League for many years. The Leagues Club provided additional funding to assist the M-W District Junior Rugby League in holding a 90th Anniversary function. 






George McTaggart (1942 - 2022) Player #168

George was a Local Junior from Collaroy SLSC and played at Centre and Wing between 1960–70, debuting in First Grade on May 1, 1965 (Rd 4). George played in both Manly Reserve Grade Grand Finals in 1968 and 1969, winning the latter as Captain. George was a Policeman by trade since 1966 and retired in 1997 with a rank of Detective Senior Sergeant.

Peter Kelly (1940 – 2022) Player #169

Peter came to Manly as a Fullback after one season of First Grade with Balmain. A very good goal-kicker and solid defender, Peter forced his way into Manly's First Grade with a debut on May 8, 1965 (Rd 5). In this match, Peter took over the fullback spot and goal-kicking duties, with Bob Batty moving to the centres. Peter lived in Frenchs Forest, was a primary school teacher and worked for St Vincent de Paul. Peter's stint at Manly ended in 1967.



Peter O'Dwyer (1936 - 2022)

Peter O'Dwyer made an extraordinary contribution to rugby league in the Manly-Warringah district, including 40 years of continuous service with the Manly-Warringah District Junior Rugby League of which he was a Life Member. Peter served on the Board of the Northern Eagles, as well as the first Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club Board post the return of the Sea Eagles and privatisation in 2004. Peter's contribution to public life went beyond rugby league, in particular surf lifesaving where he was a Life Member of the Freshwater Surf Club and of Sydney Northern Beaches Surf Lifesaving. He was awarded a Centenary Medal for his contribution to Sport on the Northern Beaches.
