## FOREWORD TO THE REPORT

Welcome to the 2017 Annual Report of the Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club Limited.

As has been the case for many years, this Report has been produced in order to ensure the records from the season past are properly documented as part of our role in maintaining the heritage of the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles.

By doing so we do not purport to represent the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles Limited (the Sea Eagles) which is a separate legal entity from the Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club Limited (the Football Club).

The MWRLFC is a minority owner of the MWSE and the Board believes it is critical to maintain the history of the Club, including the documentation of statistics and individual player records. We regard the production of this Report as an important contribution to the Club as a whole.

In 2017 we have continued to maintain the system of allocating a number to every player who has played a match in the first grade/NRL team. Whether it be one game or 300 games, they are given a unique, permanent number from the day they make their debut.

As foreshadowed in the 2016 Report we are pleased that under the current management of the Football Department of the MWSE that each player now has their number on their gear. We would like to see this developed further in the future.

Once again this Report has been compiled from publicly available data and our own records without cooperation from the MWSE. The production of the Report is done on a voluntary basis and the cost of printing the Report is funded by the Football Club and its members.

We will continue to produce this Report as we view it as a valuable contribution to the history of our great Club.

At the start of the season none of the so-called experts rated our NRL team's chances of making the top eight. But after a shaky first two games followed by a thumping defeat of the Cowboys in Townsville, the team began to produce some consistency and class led by new Captain Daly Cherry-Evans. There were some amazing late victories, including two golden point wins against the Canberra Raiders and one against the Warriors, which nearly had half of the northern beaches in the emergency ward, and a sensational second half come from behind win against the Roosters at Brookvale. After completely outclassing the fancied Panthers at Brookvale in the final game for the season, we returned to the finals after a two-year absence. On behalf of all members I wish them both all the very best health and happiness in retirement. I'd be happy for them to join my touch footy team anytime!

It's been another year of change for the Board of the Football Club. Earlier in the year long time Board member Chris Jones resigned. As well as being a passionate Sea Eagles supporter and Football Club member, Chris was responsible for setting up all our online systems and website and we thanks him for his service on behalf of the Football Club. We were however extremely happy that Chris's vacant Board position was filled by former first grade player David O'Donnell. Dave debuted for the Club in 1989 and played 81 first grade games at hooker. Dave currently runs a successful business, and for many years has devoted his time to local junior rugby league at the Mona Vale Raiders. He brings new skills and experience to our Board.

We are also farewelling fellow Director Bob Reilly. Bob was a founding Director of the post privatised Manly-Warringah Rugby League Football Club. Along with other founding Directors such as Philip Dean, Kerry Sibraa and Cathy Wagner, he fought hard to ensure the members of the original Football Club were able to keep their stake in the Sea Eagles within the new privatised structure. Fighting to protect the rights of the members and the Preference Share was not always easy and came at a high personal cost for Bob and his family. There can be no doubt Bob's heart was always in the right place and we owe him thanks for all he has done for the Football Club and his unwavering support for the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles. Thanks Bob.

Thanks also to my fellow Directors for their ongoing service to the Club and I wish all our members a safe and happy Christmas and 2018. GO MANLY!

## VALE

We mourn each and every Football Club member who passes away. Often we don't hear of the passing of one of our members until sometime later – for example when we send an email or mail correspondence.

We note with great sadness the passing of two of our longest members – Kevin Barsi (117) and Jack Twentyman (147). Kevin is survived by his brother Keith who is an original 1946 member. Kevin's number has been taken by his grandson Scott. Jack Twentyman, who would have turned 100 years old this month is survived by his daughter Julie, also one of our valued members. Julie will now take her father's member number. We also note the passing of Pagliaccio Pasquale (227).

We pass on our condolences to the family and friends of any football club member who has passed away in 2017.

### ADRIAN ASTORQUIA (1943-2017)

Adrian Astorquia was player number 189, who debuted for the Sea Eagles first grade team in 1968. He played 3 first grade games and many Reserve and Third Grade games for the Club and was a member of the 1969 and 1973 Reserve Grade Premiership-winning teams.

### KEITH BLACKETT (1945-2017)

Keith Blackett was player number 201, who debuted for the Sea Eagles in 1970, playing 3 games. He was also a prominent Rugby Union player with Manly.

### GLENN THORPE (1933-2017)

Glenn Thorpe made his first-grade debut in 1954 and was player number 95. He played 16 games at the top level for the Sea Eagles until a knee injury stopped his playing career. He was also a member of the 1954 Manly-Warringah (first ever) Reserve Grade Premiership team. Glenn was a co-founder of the Harbord United Football Club, something he was very proud of.

### RICHARD BURKE (1926-2017)

Richard Burke was player number 31 who made his first grade debut for the Sea Eagles in its first year – 1947 and played 10 first grade games. He was a long serving President of Dee Why Surf Club.

### RUPERT HUDSON OAM (1928-2017) LIFE MEMBER

Rupert (Reub) Hudson a foundation member of the Football Club and the Manly-Warringah Rugby Leagues Club. He was player number 53, making his first grade debut for the Sea Eagles in 1949, playing 5 first grade games, but 155 games for the Sea Eagles in all grades. He was part of the teams that won the Third Grade Competition in 1952, Reserve Grade runners up in 1953, and Reserve Grade premiers in 1954.

His playing career was cut short by a tragic car accident. Reub then devoted his life to serving not only the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles but also the St Vincent de Paul Society. Reub was a coach and Club official, including President of the Football Club between 1993 and 1998. He was also a long serving Director at the Leagues Club between 1959 and 1998.

### WALLY O'CONNELL (1923-2017) – LIFE MEMBER

Wally O'Connell was player number 64, making his first grade debut in 1951. He played 34 first grade games. Wally was one of the Manly-Warringah Sea Eagles' finest players and one of the League's finest and most principled. Before coming to the Manly from Wollongong where he was Captain Coach of Christian Brothers, he decided to sit out of the 1950 season rather than be forced to play for Easts who used a technicality to try to stop him playing for Manly. This cost him the Australian Test Captaincy. He spent the year in a non-playing coaching role for Manly.

Wally was Captain of the 1951 Manly-Warringah team which made the Club's first grand final. Unfortunately he missed the match through injury. He played on in 1952 and retired a year later, returning to coach Manly again in 1966-67.

In a recent article published in the Big League, David Middleton referred to him as "a man of principle". He also described him as "a diminutive five eighth with a tigerish defensive attitude and classical attacking skills...one of the elite players of his era".

In 2006 he was selected in the Manly Sea Eagles 60-year team in the number 6 position.
